



AFTER THE AGP MEETING, MORE ACTIONS COME TO INCREASE MEMBERSHIP AND MAKE SITCPLA STRONGER


Dear colleagues,

We would like to summarize the events of these last weeks.

Last May 27, we met in Madrid to determine the steps to follow in the coming months. We are still considering which are the best dates to hold meetings in BCN and AGP in September, and the plan is to formalise the creation of a Norwegian section inside SITCPLA, which is the main cabin crew union in Spain, with sections in easyJet, Ryanair, Air Europa and Iberia.



We had the pleasure of holding our first meeting in AGP, where we have a modest but growing number of affiliates. Changes always begin with small steps and thanks to your involvement, we will succeed.



The colleagues of LH once again suffer the consequences of the #Focus19 with cuts of the food on board. We know that our colleagues of Uso were unable to reach an agreement with the management about this issue. Knowing this, and in order to defend the interests of our members, we ask you to contribute all the possible safetynets that you did during these last days, along with photos of the food available, as shown beside. We also give you an example of the type of report that you should produce. Throughout the next week we will provide more information about the steps we are going to take.

Finally we would like to say a few words about the agreement reached between Uso and Norwegian for BCN LH. The information we have is confusing and until next 21st June it seems that it will not be made public. In moments of confusion, we ask for caution and seriousness. Once we know the conditions of that agreement, we will be able to take the necessary measures

to defend our rights. If there is need to file suits demanding the payment of the allowances not paid retroactively, it will be done.

We would like you to remember that all the work we are doing in SITCPLA is done during the days off of the colleagues participating in this new union action. We are creating an alternative that gives voice and fights for the real needs of Norwegian cabin crew, and helps us make our workplace a better place. It is a challenging process and we need your participation, so that we all together can succeed in reaching our goals.
